We're Good Pets, So How Did We End Up in a Shelter?

When some people visit shelters there seems to be implications that we did something wrong which caused our Guardians to no longer consider us a part of the family. But the reality is that most of the time pets like us are given away through no fault of our own. You might be surprised at the top five reason pets are surrendered or abandoned which are:

- 1) The family was moving to a location that didn't allow pets.
- 2) There was a change in the family (new baby, divorce, death, etc.).
- 3) The family didn't have enough time to spend with the pet.
- 4) They were unable to afford the cost of care.
- 5) They had too many animals already (usually unexpected litters or stray animals).

Most of these reasons can be avoided with better planning or with backup plans in place which provide a safety net under one's pet. In any case none of these reasons are the pets' fault and none of these reasons should label a pet as "bad."

Life's road for unwanted pets can be a rocky one and fraught with dangers. But the road that leads to ARC can be life changing! So how does one get on that road? ARC intakes pets through direct owner inquires or through transfers from other shelters. By law, ARC (and other private shelters) cannot intake strays. The central location for these lost or abandoned pets is Lee County Domestic Animal Services. There they will be scanned for a micro-chip and reunited with their owners. If not claimed they will be placed for adoption or, in the case of over-crowding, neo-natal, behavioral or medical cases, LCDAS will reach out weekly to private shelters like ARC to pull. ARC partners across five counties to help pets in need and in the case of natural disasters will reach out across state lines.

Shelter pets like me should get a second chance at a happy home. If you think your home can offer a lifelong commitment then please come to ARC and take home one of my friends! Oh, and don't worry about me. I just got my forever home!

The Heat is ON!

Summer came early and intense this year, so let's go over some impacts on your pet. The short spurt into the store and leaving Fido in the back seat of a closed car is over! While this is never a good practice it is downright life-threatening until Florida cools down (Dec. if we are lucky).

It is also important to remember the hot pavement rule. If you can't leave the back of your hand on the pavement for 7 seconds it is too hot for dog paws. Veterinarians see a huge influx of dogs with scorched pads in summer. Please keep walks on the grass and do this in the early morning or early evening. For mid-day outings let Fido do any "business" in the backyard!

Learn the signs of heatstroke and how you can cool your pet down in an emergency. Shade and a constant source of fresh water helps avoid serious overheating. It's summer. Kick back and relax and let your dog do the same!



Rain Often Brings On "Ringworm" Season

Ringworm is often a death sentence for kittens at municipal shelters that typically do not have the staff or available space to provide the inexpensive but labor-intensive treatment necessary to cure this highly contagious skin disease. Though people and other animals may become infected with the fungus, it predominately affects stray kittens. So, when five kittens (four boys and one girl) just months old were surrendered to Lee County Domestic Animal Services (LCDAS), suffering areas of hair loss with scaly skin, open sores, and scabs, their future was grim. The situation had been made worse by the owner's attempt to treat the skin condition with a home remedy prior to surrender. The kittens' whiskers had fallen out along with much of their hair. Yikes, what to do?

Enter ARC. "As a Pet Rescue Partner of LCDAS, ARC was contacted and asked to pull these babies and begin their rehabilitation. Having an open kitten intake cottage, ARC was able to say YES! The kittens were transported to ARC and examined by our dedicated medical team. The diagnosis was confirmed, ringworm. But have no fear, the kittens began treatment immediately which entailed three weeks of twice weekly Lime Sulfur dips and oral and topical medication administered by ARC's excellent cat staff. Until cured, the kittens who were named, Anthony Fauci, Thomas Edison, Albert Einstein, Madame Curie, and Jonas Salk, were kept in quarantine. After only a week, their condition greatly improved, and their hair was already growing back.

You are thinking what a wonderful success story? And it is. But this is just one of the many success stories that happen at ARC everyday thanks to our staff, volunteers, and most importantly our donors whose contributions allow ARC to make these success stories happen.

Can this story get even better? Absolutely. Three of the five kittens have since been adopted! Lisa Ehrlich – Board Secretary
