A MEDICAL FOSTER STORY



When my husband, Ted, and I decided to foster for ARC, we figured it would be another one of the many ways we could support the shelter. Homing and caring for overflow cats and dogs until space is available onsite is certainly necessary. It was fun and the fosters soon fit in nicely with our menagerie of 2 big dogs, 2 older cats and a kitten. What we did not expect was the added joy our fosters brought to our lives. It was always hard for us to let go, but through our goodbye tears we would tell ourselves that we needed to make room for more.

So, as is typical, a friend of a friend texted me saying: "I found a Mom and 2 newborn kittens. I have been feeding them but cannot keep them. Can you help?" My answer, "Of course, where do I pick them up?" So begins the saga of Sandy, one of the newborns. Mom, Shelly, and sister, Salty, were readied for adoption after a few months. But Sandy struggled from day one. He failed to meet the same developmental milestones as his sister, i.e., slow to wean (I had to bottle feed for a short time), poor appetite, and lacked muscle development. He began to display an odd head tilt and had an unsteady gait. He survived, but what was wrong with Sandy?

It turns out that Sandy has a very rare disease called osteomyelitis. Simply put, an infection in his bones. Swelling and calcification in his tail, hocks, and jaw were identified at the ARC treatment center leading to the diagnosis. X-rays helped confirmed the diagnosis. A regimen of antibiotics and special food to help boost Sandy's weight, were ordered. Home care was needed. Were Ted and I ready for this added responsibility? Absolutely!

Last summer, we fostered, Oso, an owner-surrender dog with a broken leg. Ted and I worked every day to help get Oso healthy again and, once adoption ready, Oso quickly found his forever home. We are now committed to fostering Sandy through this very difficult time, and right now, it is still touch and go. We never thought that fostering could be even more rewarding but fostering these medical special needs pets has brought even more joy and fulfillment into our

Hyperion, a young, very friendly, sweet natured German Shepherd, remains at ARC while a medical foster is found. Hyperion has a subaortic stenosis, a heart condition that will significantly shorten his life span. Symptoms are manageable and treatable to some extent but ultimately, the condition will result in an untimely death. The required semi-annual echocardiograms are costly for some, so that's why ARC is looking for a medical foster.
