Going the Extra Mile: Gentleman Suede

Suede has been a long time favorite dog around the Animal Refuge Center. He has a long history with us. He was originally adopted and served as somewhat of a service dog for a woman with special needs. After several years, her living situation changed, and Suede returned to ARC where we welcomed him back with open arms (and lots of treats). Since he was a geriatric dog when he came back to us, we wondered if he would ever find a forever home.

This older gentleman also started to develop some significant medical issues. He had mobility problems affecting his rear legs, and then had two bouts of pneumonia. During his second episode of pneumonia, one of our long-term volunteers, Sharon Swartzbaugh expressed interest in fostering Suede. The day she made her intentions known, is the day that he started to turn the corner with his treatment while hospitalized in intensive care. The first bite of food he ate, was a treat that Sharon lovingly offered him. Once recovered from pneumonia, Suede went home with Sharon and her wonderful husband, Jim.

Suede has been enjoying the good life with his family! He spends his time getting spoiled, relaxing on the furniture, and sampling an assortment of delicious treats. This fall, Sharon noticed a small swelling on Suede's cheek. It was hoped that it would be related to a tooth problem, but unfortunately, this was much worse news. Suede was diagnosed with an osteosarcoma (bone cancer) that was inoperable due to its location. Since Suede was finally enjoying the life he was meant to have, the Animal Refuge Center (and Sharon!) were willing to do anything possible to help him. With the guidance of Dr. Sarah Kraiza, a veterinary oncologist, we decided that his best option was palliative radiation and chemotherapy to slow the growth of his cancer. Sharon took dear Suede over to the other coast of Florida once weekly for five weeks to receive his treatments. So far, so good! Suede has been responding well to treatment, and we could not be more thrilled to see this boy thriving with his loving family. Sharon exemplifies the statement "saving one animal won't change the world, but it will change the world for that one animal." Want to make a difference by fostering a special needs animal?
