Klause: No Limitations on Love

This big brindle fella had a rough start at life, but you would never know it based on his immeasurably affectionate disposition. When giant Klause was just a little puppy (well, as little as a Bull Mastiff puppy can be), he was hit by a car. He sustained major trauma to his right front leg. He had nerve damage to this leg, which left it unusable. Poor Klause still tried to use the mangled leg, and would end up bearing weight on his wrist, causing an infected callus to develop.

Klause was surrendered to ARC in January, approximately one year after his injury. When we evaluated him, we knew we had to relieve his pain and improve his quality of life. He was evaluated by Dr. Michelle Carnes, a veterinary neurologist at *Specialists in Companion Animal Neurology* (SCAN) in Naples. Dr. Carnes confirmed our fear that Klause would never have use of the limb, and it would continue to be a source of pain and infection unless we took the drastic measure of amputation. Although we didn't come to the decision lightly, we knew that Klause would be much happier on 3 paws!

Our staff veterinarian, Dr. Nicole Nichols, performed the life-improving surgery and Klause spent a few days recovering with 24 hour care at *Florida Veterinary Referral Center* (FVRC). Now that Klause has fully recovered from surgery, he is showing his appreciation with enthusiastic tail wags and tons of slobbery kisses! He is now available for adoption.


It was just that something better was waiting for her.


