What YOUR Membership Means to ARC





VicNet allows all active Volunteers to self-schedule on any device: as far out as one month ahead, or as close to service as the night before coming to ARC. It will be wonderful for the Staff to see each morning who will be at ARC to help with the care of and give some love to our amazing dogs and cats.

ARC's volunteer program has really taken off since 2021 with an increase of 320% in our active volunteers! Evidence of improvements is everywhere from the appearance of our grounds and buildings to the upgrades of walkways or functionality of our vehicles and power tools. Last, but by no means least, is the extra attention our cats and dogs get whether on-site or off-site at additional events.
