

Hurricane Barry's Aftermath-Lending a Helping Paw

When Mother Nature unleashes her wrath it's time to "leash up" canines and move them to safety. St. Landry's Parish is one of the poorest areas NW of Baton Rouge and they reached out to us asking if we could provide housing for some of their dogs. While their cats were secure in their main indoor buildings, many dogs had nothing but fully exposed outdoor kennel runs. For sixteen of these vulnerable dogs it was their lucky day since there was room for them at ARC. Tight quarters perhaps, but no flooding!



ARC often assists areas impacted by natural disasters and offered a "paw up" to cats and dogs after hurricanes Charley, Matthew, Florence, Harvey and Katrina. This time Stacey McKnight, from St. Landry Parish Animal Control, drove straight through accompanied by her 13-year-old daughter, Shi. We applaud her dedication to saving lives as well as setting a compassionate example to her daughter.

Mass intakes like this always have their challenges to staff and volunteers, but this time we were so fortunate to have the support of several veterinarians and veterinarian technicians from VCA Coral Animal Hospital. We deeply appreciate their participation and their offer of a free exam after adoption. For now, ARC's focus is treating the dogs that have heartworms (8) and a few that have Parvo. It's Hammer Time!

Sledge hammer that is! ARC has been dreaming about swinging a sledge hammer to another one of our medium sized cat buildings for a few years. The Ekstrom House has done a great job for over fifteen years housing our Leukemia cats and cats that needs special urinary tract foods. But time wears everything down to the point of no return and such is the case here!



Thanks to funding from two ARC supporters, the Ekstrom House, which consisted of an RV with a wraparound porch, can become a real inner structure with a wrap-around porch! This building will now be known as Zippy's Cottage and will be used to house our Leukemia cats. Epoxy floors will help provide disinfectant easy capability and an inner treatment "pod" will provide a smaller area to easily medicate a kitty that might have some symptom flare ups.

Like our other main cat buildings, Zippy's Cottage will have a kitchen preparation area with impenetrable countertops & cabinets, a washer and dryer and a multi-level linen closet! The living-room and sitting parlor area (Blossom's Boudoir) will accommodate multiple Kuranda cat towers and beds for climbing and napping.

It sure seems so. One of the biggest dangers to your pet? Heat stroke, which occurs when excessive body temperature takes place. In serious cases, irreversible damage and even death can occur.

Common causes of heat stroke include dehydration, elevated body temperature, confinement in hot unventilated spaces and prolonged exposure to sun. It is also important to restrict exercise and walking to early morning or late evening times. Keep in mind that hot pavement surfaces can burn the pads of your pet's paws. If you cannot place your hand on the blacktop for more than 7 seconds do not walk your pet on it. Short legged pets feel the heat radiating off pavement even more so than tall pets!

Symptoms of over-heating can include weakness, muscle tremors, excessive salivation, elevated heart rate, dark blue or bright red tongue and/or gums. If you suspect your pet is over-heated, move them into a shady or air-conditioned area, place a cool wet towel underneath and offer small amounts of water frequently. If body temperature is over 104, spray cool water on him and create a breeze. Once lowered to under 103 degrees, get your pet to the nearest veterinarian. Be sure your car is pre-cooled!

Very young kittens and puppies cannot regulate their body temperatures so providing a safe temperature is even more critical for them. Protect your pets and enjoy the summer in safety!
