

A Letter From the President



It is my pleasure to start a second term as Board of Trustees President for the Animal Refuge Center. We have worked hard to make 2018 a success and will continue to build upon our successes throughout 2019.

One of my main goals when I started was to increase our visibility, and hopefully we have done that. A cat or dog from the ARC is now featured regularly on the FOX 4 morning news as a "Pet of the Week." We have had great luck finding homes for the pets we have featured soon after the segment aired. Look for us at 7:45am on the first Wednesday of the month. Our dogs are also being featured on NBC-2 News Today in their "Who needs a walk" segment during the weather forecast. We produced two commercials which aired on more than a dozen Comcast Cable channels this fall and we sent out press releases before and after all our events. Lastly, we got great coverage

for our rescue of 19 cats and 7 dogs from South Carolina that faced being euthanized because of Hurricane Florence.

Another thing I really encourage our friends and supporters to do is to take the next step. Things like spending an extra day volunteering at the shelter, attending one of our fundraisers, increasing your donations or even getting a friend involved can really make a difference. My family took those words to heart and fostered a litter of four kittens with their mother in the spring and a litter of eight plus their mother in the fall. We are now officially "foster failures" too, because we are adopting one of the kittens, our second cat from ARC.

For 2019, the Board's focus will be on fundraising. We really need to increase our level of sponsorships and donations. *Purses for Pooches* is coming up February 23rd, the 7th Annual Casino Royale is June 28th and the Starlight Auction will be November 30th. I hope that you, your business or someone you know will support us and join us at these events. The only funding the Animal Refuge Center operates on is what you provide. We can't continue to be the home for hundreds of animals and take on the hard cases without you.

Thank you for being there. I look forward to a great year ahead.

Acclimating Your New Shelter Pet to Your Home

Adoption Day is the day your new pet has been waiting for. While this is a very happy time for you and your new pet, the changes can be very stressful on your new cat or dog. There are many steps you can take in order to make this transition an easier one.

Cats

When bringing home a new cat from a shelter, the cat will understandably be stressed. You will need to give your cat time and space to allow them to acclimate. Before you bring the new cat home, prepare a safe room for him/her. Put your new friend's food, water, and litter box in this room and make sure there is a place for him or her to hide, such as a cardboard box with a sheet draped over it. If possible, buy the same food that the shelter was feeding your cat. It's also a good idea to place some toys in the room, as well as a scratching post. Your new roommate will need some time to get used to the smells and sounds of your home. Spend time with the new them in short increments. When he or she is comfortable in the safe room (which may take a few days or even a few weeks), you can start introducing him or her to the rest of the house. The most important thing to remember is that it is a transition period and it will take time before your new cat will feel comfortable and relaxed in your home.

<u>Dogs</u>

When adopting a shelter dog, you should have a crate ready for them at your house. This will serve as their safe place and their own little "den." When you arrive home for the first time, take your new buddy to the designated potty spot and reward them with a treat for using it. Bring your new dog into your house on a leash, and give him or her a house tour while still leashed. Remember that even if the dog was housetrained at a previous home, he/she will still need frequent trips outside to prevent accidents in their new surroundings. Your new dog may also have accidents due to the stress of the new environment. Ensure your new dog has chew toys so they do not chew on the wrong things. Ask the shelter what food your new dog has been eating so you can get the same food. At ARC, we provide all adopters with roughly a week's worth of food to ease the transition to whatever healthy new food you may decide to switch him or her to. Try to establish a daily routine so your dog knows what to expect in the morning and in the evening. Dogs need structure, so you will need to teach your new dog the house rules and set boundaries. Don't leave your new dog unsupervised at first, especially if there are any other pets in the household. Every canine adoption from ARC includes 4 free sessions with a canine trainer. Be sure to take advantage of this offer!

The first few weeks after an adoption are a time of transition for both you and your new pet. Don't rush to judging your pet's actions, as they may be out of character due to the stress of the change in environment. Instead, offer patience and time for your new cat or dog to adjust to your home and schedule.

Your new pet will offer you a lifetime of love for giving them a forever home.
