Going the Extra Mile: Mishka

Mishka is a gorgeous, 7 year old, pure white Siberian Husky. Her looks are stunning, but as with so many at ARC, her story is compelling. She was surrendered to ARC in August and that's when her luck finally started to change. We were told she was in kidney failure, and it was apparent that she had a large tumor on the font of her left shoulder.

Mishka is a somewhat reserved dog, but she shows her appreciation by resting her chin gently on you and letting you pet her belly. Fortunately, during her initial intake exam and testing, we got the good news that her kidneys were functioning just fine! Soon after intake, she had surgery to remove the tumor, but unfortunately, it proved to be just too large to fully remove it while also obtaining good margins beyond the cancer.

Anytime that an extreme surgery is considered at ARC, we always weigh many factors. If we can restore the animal to a good quality of life, and free them from cancer, we pursue these treatments. Mishka was evaluated by Dr. Kraiza, a Veterinary Oncologist, and Dr. Goodrich, a Veterinary Surgeon, from *Florida Veterinary Referral Center*. After careful consideration, it was decided that the best course of treatment would be to amputate Mishka's left front leg. Removing this leg, would remove the cancer. She would require physical therapy to learn to walk well on three legs, but she would not need additional cancer treatments such as chemotherapy or radiation.

Mishka is recovering from surgery nicely and is finally cancer free! She is adjusting to life as a "tri-pawed" doggie and her scar will be hidden nicely by her thick white Husky fur soon. She is not available for adoption quite yet, but we will be thrilled to find her a forever home when the time comes.

Congratulations winners and a special thank you to Barbara Sanders for donating her month of February to ARC Mascot Lily! What a purr-fectly wonderful thing to do!





Lee Allor: Decades of Devotion

This year, ARC wants to express sincere appreciation to a principal member of our organization for the past 20 years. Lee Allor has served on the Board of Trustees since the mid 1990s, and was our President for 10 of those years. To say that he was instrumental in the evolution of ARC to the organization that we know today, is an understatement.

Like many of our volunteers, Lee and his wife Judith became involved with ARC shortly after adopting an animal, a beautiful cat named Katie. This began a decades long commitment to the shelter. Lee joined the Board of Trustees because he saw the need for the organization in our community, and he believed in the no-kill philosophy.

It was an incredibly large project relocating the shelter from a small kennel setup on Airport Road, to the spacious acreage on Old Bayshore Road where we are located today. Lee reminisced that it took nearly two years to accomplish this project, and it was very costly. The capacity at the previous location only allowed for a dozen dogs, and the new property allowed for construction of dog lodges to accommodate over 50 dogs in much nicer facilities. There have been many improvements to the design of the dog lodges over the years. The kitten cottage also was quite an undertaking. The original building needed to be overhauled with electrical work, roofing work, and fumigation before any animals could be housed there. Once completed, we were able to care for mother cats nursing litters, new intakes, and other cats with special needs. Next, a rental house on the property was converted into an on-site medical facility for ARC. This was incredible for our organization and allowed for routine veterinary care to be completed right there. Lee beams while speaking of these improvements and building projects.

Lee reminisced that he's had too many fond memories to count. But, when pressed for specifics, he recollects that Karen Holland, one of the original founders of ARC found a puppy on the side of the road on Thanksgiving day. She called Lee, and the two of them rushed the puppy to see another ARC Board Trustee, Dr. Richard Carpenter, a local veterinarian. Her wounds were extensive, it appeared she was a bait dog for dog fights, but even with the deck stacked against her, she survived. With much care from Dr. Carpenter, and the support of ARC, the puppy went on to get adopted and have a wonderful life. This was one of Lee's first experiences of "ARC Doesn't Do Easy" that he is still so fond of reciting.

A more recent incredible success story, was Phoenix. He was found, barely alive, in Alva. Lee drove to pick him up and deliver him to ARC. Lee told everyone to get ready, this dog needed us more than any he had ever seen. No one was sure if he would even survive the night. Lee told us that he sensed this dog could make it, that he had the will to live. With weeks and weeks of the right food, veterinary care, and loving care from the entire staff of ARC, Phoenix beat the odds. He went from a malnourished, parasite infested, sad soul who could barely stand up, to a strong, loving, beautiful creature that exemplified what ARC stands for.

When asked how he feels about leaving ARC after 20 years, Lee tells us that it was not an easy decision, and that he knows it will leave a void in his life, but that at this time in his life it is a good decision. He leaves with pride about where ARC started, and where it is today. He never dreamed that so much would be accomplished. He is comfortable that the new leadership team is committed to the motto that was established several years ago: Shelter, Adopt, and Educate. Lee proclaims that the work being done today is phenomenal, and he is pleased to pass the torch to the wonderful, capable group that will move ARC forward.

Join us in wishing Lee Allor a fantastic next chapter in his story. He has done so much for the homeless animals of Southwest Florida for the past two decades, and his impact on ARC will last for many years to come.
