ARC Hits the Hockey Rink Again!





ARC on TV: See Us on Fox 4's Pet of the Week Segment

Have you see our cats and dogs on TV recently? If not, then you should watch the FOX-4 Morning news. At 7:45am on the first Wednesday of every month, FOX-4 puts the spotlight on an Animal Refuge Center cat or dog up for adoption. And it works! Our featured pets are finding homes, sometimes within just a day or two of appearing on TV.

ARC Board Vice-President, Rob Spicker, and Board Secretary, Lisa Viola, are the ones who make it happen. Lisa works with the dog and cat staff to identify a good candidate and handles the transportation to and from ARC. Rob handles the live interview. The segments are produced so that the FOX-4 anchors have enough information about the pet being featured to ask Rob about it and any other relevant questions.

Since it is live TV, you never truly know what's going to happen. When Tonka, a 1½ year old Mastiff was on, he jumped up to give Rob and FOX-4 Anchor Chris Shaw a kiss. Casey, a 5 year old calico cat jumped off the table in the studio during her segment. We've had dogs spend much of their time with their back to the camera and needed to keep a group of kittens in their carrier to avoid them from running away. It may not always be easy to feature a pet on TV, but the chance to find them a home is worth it.

These segments are also a great way for the ARC to promote our events and fundraisers. Since there is almost always something coming up or happening, we get the chance to tell a different audience about The Starlight Auction, Casino Royale, Purses for Pooches, Everblades night and more. FOX-4 posts the segments to their website and we share them on the Animal Refuge Center's Facebook page to reach yet another group of people.

The relationship helped us to create great coverage when we rescued 19 cats and 7 dogs from South Carolina before Hurricane Florence in September. TV stations FOX-4, NBC-2 and WINK were there for live broadcasts, the News-Press published an article that afternoon, and ABC-7 came out a month later for a follow up. The more Southwest Florida knows what great things ARC is doing, we can do even greater things like step up again for hurricane Barry!

So, on the first Wednesday of every month, as you have coffee or breakfast, tune into the FOX 4 Morning News and see who the next Pet of the Week will be.



Introducing ARC's New **Volunteer Coordinator!**

Lots of excitement happening at ARC and this time it is in our Volunteer Program! There is a new face on property and her name is Zuliana Salerno. Zuliana was born in Colombia, South America and has a bachelor's degree in Environmental Administration from the University of Pereira. While working on her thesis, she had the opportunity to work with the local government to develop a study about the potential pollution of the Aquifer of Pereira. This study was used by the city to create the policy for water usage in the city.

In 2005 she moved to the United States and in 2006 to Georgia where she joined the Adopt a Stream Program to create two water quality monitoring sites. The sites collected two years' worth of data that were vital in the investigation of biological pollution contamination episodes. At the same time, she worked for Aflac as an insurance agent and later on she worked for the United States Postal Service.

In 2013 Zuliana moved back to Florida where she joined the Conservancy of Southwest Florida as a Naturalist in the Education Department. Zuliana assisted with the supervision of volunteers, developing the Little Explorers Programs (while achieving record attendance) and camps. At this point Zuliana realized how much she enjoyed working with volunteers. In Zuliana's opinion, "the volunteers bring with them a wealth of knowledge in many areas"

After two years, she was offered the Position of Education and Volunteer Coordinator at the Charlotte Harbor Environmental Center. Unfortunately, it was short lived because of the long commute to and from Punta Gorda for work.

Thomas Hecker, her former boss, did not forget about her and hired her again at the Everglades Wonder Gardens where she has developed the Volunteer Program, represented the organization in front of the media and developed the Education Department within the Wonder Gardens.

We are thrilled to welcome Zuliana to ARC where her experience and enthusiasm will continue to attract valuable volunteer resources. In an organization as large as ARC and with so many "fur-babies" to tend to, volunteers are essential to our ability to operate at the highest levels of compassion and efficiency.
